CURB REMOVAL AND ROADWAY EXCAVATION START MONDAY, OCTOBER 12

The existing curb and roadway along the north side of Central Avenue between 11th and 12th Streets will be removed beginning Monday, October 12. About two feet behind the existing curb will be excavated along with the curb; barricades will be placed. After removals are complete, stone for the new roadway, electrical conduit, structural soil in the planter areas and the new curb will be installed. Next, the stone will be adjusted to grade and the first layer of asphalt will be placed. This stage is anticipated to last approximately three weeks.

Once the above work is done on the north side, traffic will be switched to drive on the new north side asphalt. The contractor will then begin work the south side and repeat the same process as was done for the north side. This stage will last approximately three weeks.

After the roadway work is completed, south side sidewalk removal will begin. After the south side sidewalks are complete, the contractor will return to the north side sidewalks. All sidewalks are anticipated to be complete by early December, weather permitting.

CAN I DRIVE THRU THE CONSTRUCTION ZONE?

Central Avenue will continue to be one-way heading west. Work will be focused on one side of the street at a time to maintain traffic flow.

WHAT HAPPENS TO PARKING?

While the north side of the street is replaced, temporary parking behind the barricades for curbside pickup will not be accessible; spaces for curbside pickup will be provided on the south side. Parking along the south side of Central Avenue between 11th and 12th Streets will be available. When the contractor is working on the south side, parallel parking will be open on the north side.

WHERE CAN I CROSS THE STREET?

Crosswalks will be located at the Central Avenue intersections with 12th, Wilmette and 11th with a mid-block crossing between Wilmette Avenue and 11th Street also available.

HOW MUCH DUST WILL THERE BE?

Dust is anticipated, but the contractor will utilize water trucks to keep dust under control as much as possible.

WILL THE SIDEWALK BE DISRUPTED?

Sidewalk disruptions are not expected until November.

***Street and tree lighting will be off on the side the contractor is working and the opposite side will be lit. While working on the north side, lighting between Pescadero and the North Shore Community Bank on the east side of Wilmette Avenue will also be off. One side of Central Avenue will always display lighting.**
